



Audience scores increased indicating that attendees are better able to explain the CHA process.



Likert Score Rating Description: A score closer to 0 indicates that audience members are NOT planning to improve the top 5 health priorities. A score closer to 5 indicates that audience members ARE planning to improve the top 5 health priorities.

Post-Test Audience Score 4.55




Audience scores slightly increased indicating that many attendees already planned to improve the top priorities.

Resilient Wilco presented information about Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs) and building a resilient community.






Likert Score Rating Description: A score closer to 0 indicates that audience members are NOT able to define ACEs. A score closer to 5 indicates that audience members ARE able to define ACEs.

Pre-Test Audience Score 3.72

Post-Test Audience Score 4.77



Audience scores increased indicating that more attendees are able to define ACEs.



Likert Score Rating Description: A score closer to 0 indicates that audience members do NOT understand the main concepts of resiliency. A score closer to 5 indicates that audience members DO understand the main concepts of resiliency.


Pre-Test Audience Score 3.90

RESILIENT WILCO (CONTINUED)




Likert Score Rating Description: A score closer to 0 indicates that audience members do NOT feel equipped to implement strategies to reduce the burden of ACEs. A score closer to 5 indicates that audience members DO feel equipped to implement strategies to reduce the burden of ACEs.

Post-Test Audience Score 4-2



Audience scores increased indicating that more attendees feel equipped to implement strategies to reduce the burden of ACEs.



Likert Score Rating Description: A score closer to 0 indicates that audience members do NOT plan to partner with organizations to advance health equity and build resilience in the community. A score closer to 5 indicates that audience members DO plan to partner with organizations to advance health equity and build resilience in the community.

Pre-Test Audience Score 4-48

Post-Test Audience Score 4.58



Audience scores slightly increased indicating that many attendees already planned to partner to advance health equity and build resilience in the community.

CONCLUSION

In conclusion, Likert scale average scores increased for ALL learning objectives measured. The largest increases in score were for the following statements:

- I can describe the history of the WilCo Wellness Alliance
- I feel equipped to implement strategies to reduce the burden of ACEs
- I can explain the community health assessment process

Limitation: There were fewer Post-Test responses turned in than Pre-Test responses and on occasion, questions were skipped or unmarked.
