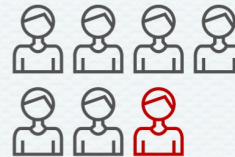
HEALTH INSURANCE

BARRIERS TO ACCESS

Despite increases in primary care services; many barriers reduce access to appropriate care including:

1. Lack of health insurance coverage
2. Limited availability of health care providers who treat low-income and/or uninsured
3. High cost of health services
4. Lack of transportation
5. Lack of knowledge of resources
6. Sustainability of healthcare programs and services for low-income and/or uninsured
